- experience of projects of this type and size
- creative design skills, including record of design awards and reputation
- geographical location, proposal for this project
- financial and commercial stability
- track record of completing projects within time and budget
- resources, including computer systems and skills
- project management systems and skills
- qualifications and experience of key personnel
- other proposed consultants

Mark (out of 100)	Interpretation
90+	Outstandingly good with a high capability clearly demonstrated, impressive personnel qualities, design abilities, resources and clear evidence of establishing excellent client rapport.
80+	Very good all round. The Panel is confident that the team would carry out the requirements of the commission in a very satisfactory manner.
70+	Would represent a sound but not distinguished appointment. The Panel has no doubts about team's abilities to carry out the commission.
60+	Just acceptable. No serious doubts about team's abilities but is lacking in some aspects

50+	A team who are not acceptable because of limited abilities/experience resources but is not far short of requirements.
40+	A team with serious failings in abilities/experience/resources and who failed to confirm the Panel's pre-qualification assessment.
